

Resource Use and Renewable Energy Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) (formerly titled 'Resource Use SPD') Statement of Public Participation: January 2014 Consultation

Explanatory Note:

This statement sets out:

- the persons that were consulted by Fenland District Council during the January 2014 consultation on the draft Resource Use SPD;
- a summary of the main issues raised by those persons; and
- how these issues have been addressed by the Council in the revised draft SPD.

For information purposes, this statement also sets out the changes to the SPD which are necessary as a result of the amendments made to the Local Plan (previously referred to as the Core Strategy) prior to its adoption and any other changes (such as factual updates) which have been identified by Fenland District Council.

1. Introduction

- 1.1. Fenland District Council wishes to thank all those who took the time between 14 January 2014 and 24 February 2014 to comment on the draft Resource Use SPD.
- 1.2. The SPD has been prepared to provide guidance on resource use and renewable energy in order to support Policy LP14 "Responding to Climate Change and Managing the Risk of Flooding in Fenland" of the Local Plan, a development plan document (DPD). The SPD will help developers in preparing planning applications for submission to Fenland District Council and will also aid the Council in making informed decisions on relevant applications.
- 1.3. When adopted, it will have the status of a Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) and will form part of the Council's planning policy framework, supplementing policy LP14 of the Fenland Local Plan (DPD). The SPD will have status as a material consideration in the determination of planning applications, though the Local Plan will have the greatest 'weight' in legal terms when the Council determines planning applications. However, the Local Plan only sets the overarching policy approach to planning in Fenland: this SPD provides more detailed guidance on how Policy LP14 will be implemented.



2. Compliance with Regulations

- 2.1. The Town and Country Planning Regulations 2012 require the Council to consult the public and stakeholders before adopting a SPD. Regulation 12(a) requires the Council to prepare a statement featuring details of those who the Council consulted; a summary of the main issues raised during the consultation; and details of how these issues were addressed by the Council and any consequential changes to the SPD.
- 2.2. The consultees invited to comment on the January 2014 draft of the Resource Use SPD during the consultation period included: all parish councils in and around Fenland; neighbouring district and county councils; local businesses; interest/pressure groups; religious organisations; infrastructure providers and any other body, party or individual that has specifically requested to be informed of Neighbourhood Strategy (Planning Policy) consultations. A list of the organisations consulted can be found in Annex A.
- 2.3. The table below summarises all the main issues raised during the consultation period and Fenland District Council's response to the issues raised. All comments received have been read and considered in detail. If no changes have been made as a result of comments received, the reason/s for this is explained.



3. Issues raised during public consultation (14 Jan- 24 Feb 2014)

However, the final Planning Practice Guidance website has now been launched (2014) and the statement that SPDs cannot be used to introduce new policies has been removed and there is no longer any such reference to the content of policies within SPDs (see National Planning Practice Guidance, Ref ID 12-028-20140306). Nevertheless, it is conceded that perhaps some of the draft policies in the SPD as consulted upon may be considered to go beyond the legal remit of a SPD.	Partly as a concession to the representations received and partly after reconsidering the regulations and national policy, Part 3 of the SPD and the policies within this section have been restructured and reworded to demonstrate more explicitly how the SPD and the policies expand on the principles outlined in policy LP14 of the Local Plan. These changes make it clear that the policies are not completely new policies, but rather they complement existing (Local Plan) policies. Specifically, each of the wind turbine, solar and biomass sections have been restructured to contain policies entitled as per the factors listed in part A of policy LP14 (i.e. the factors that will be taken into account when assessing proposals for renewable energy). Some of the principles featured within the first draft of the SPD have been retained and simply re-distributed under the appropriate new policy headings, while some principles have been amended or removed in light of comments received during the consultation, as summarised below.

4. Other changes identified by Fenland District Council

In addition to the changes identified as a result of the public consultation, the Council has also identified changes which are necessary as a result of: amendments to the submission version of the Core Strategy prior to its formal adoption (renamed at adoption to be Local Plan); typographical errors; and amendments identified to ensure the content of the SPD remains relevant. The main changes are outlined below.
