Environmental Grants are judged by a panel of community peers to ensure fair community representation. Only communities groups can apply for the grant and there must be an environmental benefit to the community.

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Energy grants are for vulnerable people to the cold such as those with a disability and older people and very young, and to pregnant women.

Committees of the environmental grants are advertised in local papers and social media. Positions available 2 from each village allowed ensuring fair representation of the community. Scoring matrix to judge suitability of projects to be marked by committee to make the process fair.
