# What has been happening so far?

We are making good progress with constructing the footways at the southern end of Broad Street, with only the works in front of Specsavers, Clarks and Ladbrokes left to complete. These works are due to be finished by end of July.

The new war memorial concrete steps and sandstone is close to completion and will be completed by end of July. All works will be done with extreme care and respect. The war memorial is looking fantastic.

# Upcoming Traffic Management Changes

• The temporary two-way traffic light system on Broad Street has been removed and this has made the traffic flow on Broad Street much better in town, reducing the delays.

Further drainage system works will continue on the West side of Broad Street.

The Riverside works will continue, with the installation of the new drainage system and planters.

- The pedestrian crossing on the bridge will remain closed until further notice. Alternative safe crossing points have been provided and will be maintained.
- We will continue to monitor the traffic movement through the town ensuring optimal traffic movement is managed.
- Any future changes will be communicated well in advance.

### What's coming up in the next month?

- We will continue to progress the new paving works on Broad Street in co-ordination with the shops, maintaining accessibility at all times.
- The Riverside works will continue including installing the new drainage system and the planters plus in the coming weeks the new paved area will start to be installed.
- New public realm area works in front of the shops on the west side of Broad Street will continue.
- New planters and tree pits will be installed in the public realm section on the west side of Broad Street.
- All the final paving will be completed in July on the east side of Broad Street and the section of footway will be completely open to the public.
- The fountain has now been collected from Fenland's depot and is now having a full refurbishment in preparation for it being returned to site and being installed at the end of September.
