Project Newsletter - August 2024

Welcome to the 9th edition of the March Town Centre Regeneration Project newsletter, produced by Octavius, working for Cambridgeshire County Council and Fenland District Council. We would like to confirm the project completion date will now be in November.

What has been happening so far?

New paving work continues to make good progress on Broad Street with access to the shops being maintained to all times.

Paving in the Riverside area is now 90 per cent complete, and all planters and tree pits in this area have been installed.

On the west side of Broad Street, we are continuing works on the public realm section in front of the shops. All planters and tree pits in this area have also been installed.

All paving is completed on the east side of Broad Street and the footway is now finished and open to the public. The fountain was collected from Fenland's depot and is now having a full refurbishment.

The war memorial paving is now complete and making good progress with the paving on west side of broad street. The memorial looks fantastic with the new paving.

The granite planters are being installed on the south side of Broad Street and we are making good progress in this area on the Riverside.

<u>Upcoming Traffic Management</u> <u>Changes</u>

- The pedestrian crossing on the bridge will remain closed until further notice. Alternative safe crossing points have been provided and will be maintained.
- We will continue to monitor the traffic movement through the town ensuring optimal traffic movement is managed.
- Any future changes will be communicated well in advance.
- Week commencing 23rd September, there will be a 5 night full closure of Broad Street to install the final wearing course to the carriageway. The road will remain open during the daytime.
- The main crossing in the centre of town will be opened on completion of the surfacing works.
- There will be no access to the site office on Broad Street during September as we are completing works on the pathway in front and at the side of the office.
- PUBLIC TOILETS Please note access to the public toilets will be temporarily restricted. The public toilets is currently accessed from Dartford Road to Grays Lane, due to the works being completed on Broad Street pathway. There is no access to the toilets from Broad Street.

What's coming up in the next month?

- We will continue to progress the new paving works on Broad Street in co-ordination with the shops, maintaining accessibility at all times.
- The Riverside paving works will continue in this area until the end of the project works. New public realm area works in front of the shops will also continue.
- Work will continue on installing new planters and tree pits in the public realm section, west side of Broad Street. Two planters are already installed and work ir progressing well.
- The fountain has been collected from Fenland's depot and is now undergoing a full refurbishment. Meanwhile, the fountain steps are currently being installed. The fountain is due to be returned and installed in its new position in October.
- On September 23, a 5 night closure is planned for the final wearing course and road marking in Broad Street.
- The works in front of the shops on the west side of Broad Street are due to start in the middle
 of September. We will communicate with the shops to ensure they are kept informed and
 continue to maintain access to the shops.
- Works are due to start on the pathway in Grays Lane and outside office at 2 Broad Street.

Coffee and Chats

The Coffee and Chat events will be cancelled in September as pathway works outside the front of the office mean there will be restricted access to the public.


Sustainability & Social Value




