The premises will be operated as a well-managed and responsible licensed venue. The licence holder and designated premises supervisor will ensure that the premises is run in full compliance with the Licensing Act 2003 and all relevant statutory requirements. The management of the premises is committed to promoting the four licensing objectives: the prevention of crime and disorder public safety the prevention of public nuisance the protection of children from harm Appropriate policies, procedures, and staff training will be in place to support these objectives. Staff will be properly trained, supervised, and made aware of their

b) The prevention of crime and disorder *

responsibilities under the licence. The premises will maintain effective communication with responsible authorities and will respond promptly to any concerns raised. The operation of the premises will be regularly reviewed to ensure continued compliance and responsible management.

c) Public safety *

A Challenge 25 age-verification policy will be in place for all alcohol sales. All staff will receive training on licensing law, refusal of service, and conflict management, with training records kept on site. CCTV will be installed and maintained, covering entry and exit points and public areas, with recordings retained for a minimum of 28 days and made available to the police or authorised officers upon request. An incident and refusals log will be maintained and reviewed regularly. The premises will work closely with local police and comply with any relevant local crime-reduction schemes.

d) The prevention of public nuisance *

The premises will comply with all fire safety, health and safety, and building regulations. Maximum occupancy levels will be clearly defined and not exceeded. Emergency exits will be clearly marked, unobstructed, and regularly checked. Staff will be trained in emergency procedures, including evacuation and first aid awareness. Regular risk assessments will be carried out and reviewed.

e) The protection of children from harm *

Noise levels will be controlled, with doors and windows kept closed where appropriate. Customers will be encouraged to leave the premises quietly and respectfully, particularly during late hours. Clear signage will remind patrons to respect neighbours when entering and leaving. External areas will be monitored to prevent excessive noise, litter, or antisocial behaviour. Waste and bottle disposal will be managed to minimise disturbance.

Children will not be permitted on the premises during licensed hours unless accompanied by a responsible adult (where applicable). Age-restricted products will only be sold in accordance with Challenge 25 procedures. No inappropriate entertainment, imagery, or material will be accessible to children. Staff will be trained in safeguarding and age-verification responsibilities.
